Reading improves your self-discipline and consistency


Reading increases your knowledge of history

CHESS TOURNAMENT

The Newtown School chess team participated in the Chess Power 2018 National Teams Championship in Auckland last weekend. The event brought together 359 avid competitors from 71 schools across the breadth of the country. Newtown School was one of 24 schools in the Junior division. In the Junior division, there were 24 schools and 134 participants, including Jamie, Yuki, Pirihira and Luna from Newtown School. These students flew to Auckland on Friday or Saturday, and then played in the tournament all day on Sunday, flying back to Wellington on Monday.

The level of competition at the tournament was very high, as these are the best school teams in the country. Each player had to play 9 games of chess in one day, which is not an easy feat, even for the top players. The scores of the team members are then added up, and the schools are then placed according to their total point score. Newtown School came in 24th place. They wore their school shirts with pride, and in particular displayed the school values of resilience and aroha. We were particularly impressed how they all supported each other throughout the course of the tournament, especially toward the end of the day.

Thanks to the school for supporting the chess team this year and for helping us make this trip to Auckland. Thanks to all the school whanau who supported our fundraising events.
