CURRICULUM CORNER

Our children respond to change...

This week, across the school, students visited or welcomed new friends into new spaces. We saw faces of joy, uncertainty and excitement. We heard sounds of laughter, silence and new conversations. We noticed beginnings of new friendships, awareness of not knowing exactly what to do and unexpected maturity of responses.

We found new leaders, kind helpers, reassuring friends, funny teachers and interesting activities.

How exactly do we respond to changes? How can we help our children make the most of change that occurs? Here are some strategies that help our children embrace change positively...

- Cultivate 'big likings'...this develops passion
- Teach them to embrace diverse ideas and accept feedback..this fosters intellectual humility, remember no one has all the answers.
- Free their ideas-this flips complaints into opportunities
- Expose them to innovation-this introduces kids to real-life inventors and problem solvers
- Use writing and arts to develop emotion regulation and empathy-this builds self understanding
- Give them room to explore and imagine-this helps kids feel they can navigate the world independently
- **Don't think of ourselves as our kid's boss-**the more we control kids, the more we lower their sense of control and motivation
