The following 'think piece' framework explains why we hold our Learning Conversations. They provide a formal opportunity to develop 'Relationships for Learning'.

Child well-being at the heart:

Information sharing and building partnerships is about developing three-way genuine relationships that focus on learning and progress. They're where you know you are working together on something that is really important.

Why are three-way partnerships important?

- Students want to learn and progress and need support to take risks, make changes, and share their thinking.
- Parents and whānau know their child best. Their strengths, weaknesses, interests and are the most important 'out-of-school' influences.
- Teachers make a difference they know and understand pedagogy and the curriculum. Research shows they are the strongest inschool influence on learning.

<u>Ākonga are more likely to succeed when</u> <u>parents, whānau and their teachers:</u>

- Work together in a way that is focused on learning
- Sharing information and knowledge expertise
- Understanding and celebrating similarities



Kia Manaaki - Respectful

Ka whakamana tātou id ngā rongo o te katoa. We value the thoughts and feelings of each other.

Hand Washing-Guide from Ministry of Health

Wash hands for 20 seconds. Dry hands for 20 seconds

- 1. Wet your hands under clean running water. Use warm water if available.
- 2.Put soap on your hands and wash for 20 seconds. Liquid soap is best.
- 3. Rub hands together until the soap makes bubbles.
- 4. Rub on both sides of both hands ...
- 5. and in between fingers and thumbs ...
- 6. and round and round both hands.
- 7. Rinse all the soap off under clean running water. Use warm water if available.
- 8. Dry your hands all over for 20 seconds. Using a paper towel is best (or, if at home, a clean dry towel).

Always wash and dry your hands Before:

• Eating or preparing food.

After:

- Sneezing, coughing or blowing your nose (or wiping children's noses)
- Gardening (or playing outside for children)
- Having contact with animals
- Going to the toilet or changing nappies
- Looking after sick people.

Bee Healthy Dental Van Onsite


