# PRINCIPAL - TUMUAKI KŌRERO

Kia ora Whānau, Friends & Caregivers,

Congratulations 'team,' we are in level 1- what an amazing effort by our communities.

I would like to thank you all for the way you supported your children to adapt to the Level 2 protocols that were in place. It has been wonderful to hear about how they have settled into our new 'normal' and are coping with getting set up for the day's learning independently. It is also important that I recognise the trust you have placed in our staff to manage your child's health and welfare as we move forward. Current daily student attendance is now back to what we would expect at this time of year, which is an excellent indicator that we are back on the right track.

The last couple of weeks have been about reconnecting and reestablishing relationships with our students and with each other. We are also keen to get school based learning underway again. After this week, we still have three weeks left of the term and we want to make the most of this time. One of the positives that has come out of the lockdown is the advances in online technology. New knowledge, skills and applications have been learnt, by both children and adults. With improved access to digital tools throughout the lockdown period, we have been able to make rapid gains in the sharing of student learning and progress.

We have reviewed our planning and reporting timeline to allow for students to be reintroduced to face to face learning, as well as for assessments to be completed so we are able to plan meaningful learning and teaching activities. This will also allow us and our learners to report on their progress. The COVID19 pandemic 'learning from home' time has meant we need to alter when we provide the first written report and learning conversations. Mid-year student progress reports will now be sent home in Term 3 on Friday 21st August, with Learning Conferences held the following week.

## EXCITING NEWTOWN SCHOOL PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT NEWS

We have been fortunate to be able to successfully coordinate a number of proposed property redevelopment projects for our school - all of these projects are planned to get underway this school year!

**Wellington City Council** has approved the release of their funds **(\$500,000)** to renovate our school swimming Pool to a stage 1 level (a fully functional pool). Our school will contribute other allocated funding over the coming years to finish the total upgrade.

**The Ministry of Education** has approved and funded the redevelopment of **Old Tui**. This large space will now become a new administration area, school library, staffroom and meeting spaces.

**The Ministry of Education** have also confirmed the redevelopment of our **Old staffroom and Moana learning spaces** into new modern learning spaces.

Initial plans are underway for the construction of a new **'school sandpit'** to be located on the Emmett Street area beside the deck and prefabs.

Other projects being scoped out at the moment, include the upgrade of parts of our school hall and kitchen for future redevelopment.

Paul Forrest, our artist in residence is continuing to inspire our tamariki! Faces light up as he walks in and the business of being an artist gets underway. This term Paul is continuing to teach across the school; ask your child to show you their work, it is inspiring.

Paul is also running an opt in class for Curiosity Monday and has begun a targeted small group to work on a project that will adorn our school. More on this later! Check out our exhibition space.
