I feel a sense of relief that a decision has been made in relation to our regions and school Covid 2 level. The Prime Minister last evening announced we will stay at alert level 2 for the next 12 days. (this will be reviewed on 21 August)

The Prime Minister said, "In keeping with our precautionary approach, and New Zealand's philosophy of going hard and going early, today Cabinet has agreed to maintain our current settings for an additional 12 days, bringing us to a full two weeks in total."

"Our current expectation is that by this time, the perimeter of the cluster will be identified, will be isolated and we can move to Level 2 in Auckland with confidence."

I know you and our community are all doing everything possible to support our children and young people during this unsettling time. Thank you for your ongoing respectful support of our school. Working together to minimise community transmission is a goal that unites us all.

Thank you to the large group of parents that attended our 'How do we share your child's learning with you', afternoon and evening workshops this week. If you missed these informative events and would like to know more about how our school 'reports to you about your child' learning' feel free to contact me or our whanau teachers about the key messages we shared.

You will receive home this week your child's Learning Record (report) that will inform you about your child's learning - Learning Conversations will be held the following week. A link to the Learning Conversation (booking schedule) will be sent home next week. Both the Learning Record and Learning Conversations are an excellent way to celebrate your child's learning and to talk with our staff about their learning achievement and progress.

We invite all whānau to attend the completion of our "Butterflies Together" project. Friday 21 August 2pm at school. 13 large student painted butterflies celebrating their cultural diversity are to be installed on the eastern side of whanau Tui. This will create a huge kaleidoscope of butterflies that creatively celebrates the cultural diversity of Newtown School and community.

IMPORTANT MESSAGES

COVID -19 LEVEL 2

The Alert Level for our Greater Wellington Region is Level 2. At this stage Alert Level 2 will be in place until it is reviewed on 21 August.

Newtown School will be open as normal, under Covid level 2 conditions.

We as a school and a community are very familiar with level 2 having successfully navigated our way through it in May.

Some of our school key Level 2 messages are:

- It is safe to send your child to school under level 2. We are reassuring children that we and you are keeping them safe.
- Stay home if you or your child are sick seek advice from the Health line or your GP.
- Stay home if you are waiting for covid test results.
- Wash hands thoroughly hand sanitizer and soap is throughout the school
- Cough and Sneeze into your arm or a tissue
- We record who is on site Use the Government Covid Tracker App to record your own personal movements these are placed around our school
- All visitors must come to our office and sign in
- Drop off your child after 8:30am from behind the 'green line' .
- Pick up your child at 3pm from behind the 'green line' .
- Please have your child bring a water bottle to school the water fountains around the school are closed.
- No parents are to enter school buildings unless invited by a school teacher.
- The Emmett Street entrance is closed.
- Social distancing requirements are in place for adults in our playground.
