CURRICULUM CORNER - BILINGUAL EDUCATION AT NEWTOWN

Tau Mai te Reo - the Māori Education Strategy for English Learners provides schools with the mandate and responsibility to increase the use of Te Reo me ngā Tikanga Māori alongside a culturally responsive curriculum. This is the companion to Ka Hikitia, the Māori Education Strategy for Māori learners, which tells us:

Whakamaua te pae tata kia tina – Take hold of your potential so it becomes your reality...We are descendants of explorers, discoverers and innovators who used their knowledge to traverse distant horizons. Our learning will be inclusive, equitable and connected so we progress and achieve advances for our learners and their future journeys and encounters, Whāia te pae tawhiti kia tata – Explore beyond the distant horizon and draw it near!

The Guiding Principles of Tau Mai Te Reo are:

He taonga te reo

The Māori language is a taonga of iwi and Māori and an integral part of our national identity as New Zealanders.

It is important to give practical effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi through Māori language in education.

Tuakiritanga

Māori learners thrive when their identity, language and culture is embedded into their learning and they have a strong sense of belonging.

Te Whare o te Reo Mauri Ora

The Crown and Māori have important roles to play in supporting the Māori language. It is important to work in partnership and support strong relationships between learners and whānau, educators and others.

He reo kōrero, he reo ora

It is important to grow the number of New Zealanders with Māori language skills and to grow the environment where conversing in te reo Māori in every day contexts is a social norm.

He huarahi ako

Māori language learning is a life-long journey across many pathways. It is important to ensure learners achieve excellent education outcomes through this journey.

We are excited about our Newtown School journey with bilingual education and very proud of the heritage that we are able to build on. We have a very successful Māori Medium class that has been part of our school for 34 years, and is a vital part of our community. We are thankful to you - our whānau and community - for going on this journey with us and for overwhelming interest and support for both Māori Medium and Bilingual education. We will be running a bilingual class(es) in 2021 and this will be a great opportunity for our English Medium students to be able to increase their level of Te Reo Māori.
