Kia ora koutou te whānau,

Welcome back everyone to Term 4, we are loving seeing all our happy tamariki back at school this term.

A big thank you to all our whānau for your support as we continue to navigate Level 2. We certainly are very grateful to be living in Wellington and are thinking of our extended families and whānau that are still in level 3 in Auckland and surrounding areas.

Thanks to those parents that supported the running of our athletics sports day held on a sunny wind-free day last Friday. We appreciate your commitment to our tamariki and staff, to ensure this event was the success it was. Unfortunately our amazing athletes selected for the Southern Zones won't be able to compete this year, due to the event being cancelled (covid related).

I am sure you have watched with interest when the new Public Health Order was announced on Monday. The Order mandates that all school staff are to be fully (Covid) vaccinated by the 1st of January 2022. This will also have implications for any person on the school site who will work with or could come into contact with students e.g. volunteers, camp parents, contractors. Our first step at this stage is to create a register of all Newtown School staff and their vaccination status. We will keep you informed as further directions and guidelines are received from the Ministry of Education.

In Tūī they are exploring life cycles and the growth that happens with ourselves as babies and animals.


The students have noticed that life cycles show how animals and plants grow and change during their lives.
