## PRINCIPAL'S PĀNUI

Kia ora whānau.

It is hard to believe we are nearing the end of this term already. Covid within our community has added complexity and challenges for us, as it has in the rest of New Zealand. We will continue to work hard to be responsive to what is needed and to stay as healthy as we can.

**Celebrations.** This time of year is significant for a number of communities within Newtown School. It is currently Ramadan for our Mulism families and it will soon be Easter for our Christian families. During these special times we learn what is important for each other and we ask questions with respect to help grow our understanding. We value being part of a diverse community.

Current news. A number of students of all ages have been aware of the situation in Ukraine. As parents and teachers these are challenging topics to explore with young people. With our digital capacity now, our children often see and 'experience' news in quite a different way from the past.

We use the language of our school values to help them respond with compassion and care and to look for actions of whanaungatanga. To balance, we note people who have enabled transformative change so tamariki will be inspired to be people who can make a difference. People such as Moana Jackson, who passed away recently. I read a quote of his impact 'Matua Moana made me want to be a thinker, an educator, an organizer and a doer.' We remind our tamariki of the positive impact they can have on others.

Building projects. On a final practical note there are a number of building projects on the go at Newtown this term. Our pool is awaiting an aspect of final compliance and now a need to purchase a heat pump. No swimming yet but we are working hard to make it happen.



The Board is there to provide strategic direction to the school, reflect the community perspective and ensure that our school has all of the resources it needs to provide a great learning and working environment for our akonga (students) and staff.

In my role I meet regularly with Nicki our Tumuaki and set the agenda for our Board of Trustee meetings, which happen monthly. At those meetings Nicki and other staff tell us about all of the different operations of the school and about new developments in the education sector - we ask questions and agree actions for the staff and for the Board members where needed. Minutes of our meetings are taken by our wonderful minute taker Steve, and after they have been approved at the next Board meeting they are available on our website.

It has been a real pleasure and honour serving on the School Board. I love learning more about all of the fantastic work of our community and being able to provide guidance and support when tricky issues arise - Covid has been an example of this and has given many opportunities for the Board and school to work together while playing their distinct governance and operational roles.

For those who have previously contributed in governance at the early childhood level, you will be pleasantly surprised to find that being a school trustee is not as onerous a task - we are very well supported by the school staff and the NZ School Trustees Association has a wealth of training, guidance documents and templates on offer.
