## PRINCIPAL'S PĀNUI

Kia ora whānau

The past week has given us plenty to think about, with the death of Queen Elizabeth II just before the beginning of Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori. This year marks 50 years since the presentation of Te Petihana Reo Māori | Māori Language Petition to Parliament in 1972, which called for the Māori language to be taught in all schools. Colonisation caused the Māori language to almost disappear from Aotearoa, and here at Newtown School we are working hard to be part of the revitalisation of te reo Māori. On Wednesday, the whole school participated in the Māori Language Moment by gathering together to sing Ka Pioioi, followed by a free sausage sizzle.

While our country's connection with the British Crown is a remnant from the time of colonisation, and brings to mind the ongoing impact of colonisation on all of us and especially Māori, we are also mindful of the example of service set for us by Queen Elizabeth II. The Queen served the community from a position of great privilege, while the Māori Language Petition was the result of a 'grass roots' community service movement. The impact of both illustrates for us that we all have a role to play in the future of Aotearoa through our contributions to a fairer and more just community.

Tōku reo, tōku ohooho, tōku reo, tōku māpihi maurea, tōku reo, tōku whakakai marihi!

My language is my treasure, my language is my object of affection, my language is my ornamental grace.

On Monday 26th September, there will be no school, as we observe Queen Elizabeth II Memorial Day. Enjoy this extra whānau time together.

On Wednesday our Kapa Haka Rōpū performed at PWC to mark Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori. Ngāti Kotahitanga also attended Tama Iti's 'I Will Not Speak Māori' exhibition this week.

Our Year 3-6 learners have been participating in Inspiring the Future sessions to hear from volunteer role models in our community, learn about different jobs and why people love doing them, as well as their pathway and challenges they faced along the way. Inspiring the Future has been created to broaden young people's horizons, and help challenge stereotypes that can limit young peoples' potential. Ask your young person about these events, which have been held for Waitangi this week, and will continue for Põhutukawa next week.

Last year I also started to support our librarian Sam with our new library system.


