PRINCIPAL'S PĀNUI

"The role of education is to nurture, grow and realise every child's potential." 'Success For All, Every School, Every Child' launched in 2010.

This is a core belief for us as educators at Newtown School. It is an area we continually work, reflect and adapt on.

You may be aware that there is a refresh of the New Zealand Curriculum - Te Mātaiaho. There will be some key shifts in broadening our view of what success looks like. We have been and will continue to work on, upholding that all ākonga should be able to access and succeed in all aspects of their learning life - educational, social, political, economic, and cultural.

Our whole staff work on creating welcoming and inclusive environments that value the contributions of every ākonga. We support them through rich learning tasks to make informed decisions about themselves and others.

As educators we strive to provide access to knowledge, understandings and practices that promote inclusion and equity for all. A few inclusive practices in our kura:

- We employ Teaching Assistants that support the delivery of programmes. We have a team of excellent TA's who love working with our tamariki. They continually notice and respond, an essential support for inclusion.
- Whanaungatanga it is vital to feel noticed and welcomed. We work on developing this concept early at Newtown School as part of the transition process.
- Taking a strengths based approach we work with the child starting with what
 they can do and adapt as necessary. Listening to and noticing the tamariki, as
 well as communicating with whānau, help us to identify strengths and build on
 them.
- Having a rich curriculum with many experiences opportunities for children to be successful in many ways: Market Day, Bush Sprouts, Garden to Table, Sports Groups, Class Trips to name a few.
- We have very positive working relationships with outside agencies such as Resource Teachers of Behaviour and Literacy, and Ministry of Education Field Staff. They work closely with us providing advice and professional development

Every child succeeding has been an important part of my journey at Newtown School. I have loved working with our kaiako, whānau and tamariki. Together we have created environments and opportunities where everyone can succeed. I know that as a team you will continue to broaden your/our understanding of what success looks like.

COVID REMINDER
