Promote peaceful solutions and kindness

We want to be known as a kura who are peaceful and helpful. We expect that everyone treats others with kindness and care in all aspects of our day. Talk with your tamariki about how this looks and sounds for them at school. Challenges are normal for us all-we have choices in the ways we respond. Each person can make a difference to those around them by being an example. Sometimes the words we hear are: "I can pay back." Replace this with "I can respond in a different way by...breathing, taking five, helping others, speaking positively." There are many ways to solve challenges, A few reminders for us:

School start: we are noticing some late arrivals to school. Please aim to be at school with plenty of time for them to get sorted for their day.

Attendance-we track this every week. To help us, it's really important to let us know why your child is away.

We apologise for the inconvenience but this is an important meeting that the teachers need to attend.






