Help them to name their own actions and words and to always choose to make a friendship better.

We have some very passionate sportspeople who love these games-it's brilliant! Everyday this crew practises the skills of being respectful sports players. It's hard. In the face of rules, winning and losing, different skill levels-this requires practice everyday. Trying, fixing, trying again, making mistakes, trying again-this is good learning and what school is for.

How can you help? Talk about who are positive role models in sport with your children. Sometimes this is hard as many of them show unacceptable responses. Practise being a good loser. Encourage your children to be resilient.

Start of touch rugby this week, outdoor sports everywhere in our kura, swimming lessons are humming, Arohanui strings are back, amazing writing from across the school, preparation for Camp, a great first Board hui, amazing kapa Haka preparation.
