Vision Screening Information



Dear whānau

Newtown School has been offered a wonderful opportunity. We will be working with the Foureyes Foundation to check everyone's vision.

Foureyes Foundation is an eye screening program for children between the ages of 5 to 12.

The screening will take place at school and will be free. This covers a wider range of eyesight checks than their B4 school check and will pick up any changes since then. This programme is run by a charity (led by optometrist Ravi Dass) who works with Learning Support Coordinators (LSC) in schools around New Zealand.

The LSC in your school will support the screening of your child's vision over the next few weeks.

If you do not want your child's vision to be screened please contact Sarah Divers, our learning support coordinator (sarahd@newtown.school.nz)

Next steps

If the screening shows your child needs an eye test, we will provide a list of optometrists in your area that will provide the service for free. If your child needs glasses, there may be additional charges. If you have a community services card, glasses will likely be free as well.




