Recently I had the privilege of attending a conference focused on the 'science of learning.' We were posed the question of 'What's happening to childhood?

We were reminded about brain development and the increase of growth and connection within the brain when tamariki **laugh**, **sing and exercise**. As parents it is hard to resist comments that if we don't give our children a jump start then they will 'fall behind' or 'not be ready'. Have we been forced to shift to only value the visible, recordable or printable? These are great phrases for us to identify what matters most to us. What do we think really matters? When asked, our parents say: joy, kindness, collaboration, resilience, creativity, problem solving and relationships.

Do our children have time to imagine? Do they have enough open ended play? How can we guard extended uninterrupted time for play as this is where deep learning lies. Take some time to think about how your family might answer these questions, then put ideas into action .

**Staff Only Day-**Thank you for keeping your children at home while staff took the day to work together. These days are invaluable. This time we were focused on writing progressions and the teaching and assessment of writing. These times are so valuable for staff to step back from the daily tasks and focus on creativity, reflection, and collaboration. Staff engage in deeper thinking. Everyone worked hard together. Interrupted only by some extremely delicious donuts and lamingtons! Great brain food.
