



About Matariki Puanga

The rising of Puanga (also known as the star Rigel in Orion) and the Matariki star cluster (Plejades, or the Seven Sisters) mark the Māori New Year, a time to remember our loved ones who have passed and to prepare for the New Year, as we enter the colder months.

It is a special time to get together, to restore faith and hope for the future, to celebrate whanaungatanga (kinship), to be with others, to share stories and kai, and plan to work towards a sustainable future.

Puangais a single whetū (star). It's not part of the Matariki cluster but appears in the evening sky shortly before Matariki rises each year. Puanga can only be seen by a few iwi – those who are in parts of the Far North, Taranaki, Whanganui, Wellington, the Hutt Valley, and parts of the South Island. Puanga is the star acknowledged by our mana whenua iwi Te Āti Awa, while Ngāti Toa acknowledges the Matariki cluster. In Wellington we can see both Puanga and Matariki.

Students from throughout our kura grew Kūmara, Rīwai and herbs, and we received donations from Kaicycle, BGI, Kaibosh. We hope you enjoy it.

We put aside some soup meals to donate to the free food fridge at the Newtown Community Centre.
