It is really important that all children attend school every day unless they are sick. Every day attendance increases learning. If your child is going to be away please call or email us.



Following guidance from our mana whenua partners Taranaki Whānui, the preferred name for the park is Te Tini o Kahukura, with Paekahukura as a secondary name option.

About the Names

Te Tini o Kahukura means "the many or multitudes of Kahukura." The name riffs off the Taranaki rōpū Te Tini o Hākuturi, which refers to the many guardian spirits of the forest. In this context, the name recognises not only the many kahukura butterflies (New Zealand red admirals) that will be visible in the park's art installations, but also the many different users of the park space — tamariki, whānau, communities, artists, and visitors.

The alternative name, Paekahukura, is also rooted in te reo Māori naming traditions. It riffs off Paekākā (part of the Wellington Botanic Garden) and draws inspiration from Paekākāriki. It references the kahukura/red admiral butterfly and evokes the idea of a pae or gathering of them — rather than the concept of a "park" - adding a sense of place and purpose.

A series of sculptural Kahukura butterflies by local artist Paul Forrest have already been installed in the park. These works celebrate the kahukura and form part of a wider creative and educational story.

The park will soon also include mural work with local school children, and interpretive signage that tells the story of the kahukura and its ecosystem.
