Wellington South Coast Clean-up Saturday, 19th September 2020

Come on down and contribute to the calendars coolest, most colossal, and consequential coastal clean-up!!

This is the 11th Annual South Coast Clean-up, a single day event where members of the public, schools, businesses, local groups and organisations join together, along with hundreds of thousands of volunteers at other places around the world, to take part in the Ocean Conservancy's International Coastal Clean-up week.

There will be 12 sites for you to choose from, all the way from Owhiro Bay to Breaker Bay, each one operated by a different local community group (MTSW being one of those groups... come help us!).

This is a grassroots activity with aims to clear the coast of rubbish, do something positive for our local environment, and also simply to get together as a wider community.

Mountains to Sea Wellington will be out at site 3 (see map below), West Island Bay Beach. Join us, or anyone of the other community groups along the coast, at 10:30am on the 19th of September.

Gloves, high-vis, and rubbish bags are all provided, though if you have your own suitable gloves please bring them along. All rubbish will be gathered up around 12.00 and taken to Lyall Bay to be collected by the council.

At 12.30 there will be a sausage sizzle (including vegetarian) near the playground area where participants can mingle and meet each other, share stories and celebrate our collective achievement.

Be a part of this incredible day and, as they say, many hands make light work. We look forward to seeing you then.
