

There are a number of special occasions happening in our kura. When thinking about what made them stand out, I was struck by the themes of matching our actions and words. As educators and as whānau, part of our role is to inspire our children to see and hear what we consider important. They notice if our words and actions don't match.

Here are some strong examples in our kura...

**Ngāti Kotahitanga whānau** are at Te Pou o Tainui Marae in Otaki. They go to strengthen relationships, to have opportunities to hear and use Te Reo Māori and live what it means to live their values. What a powerful example of words and actions connecting. A treat on our way up was to visit Audrey Banks, who was lying in state. She was a special kaiako who started Rumaki Reo at Newtown (currently Ngāti Kotahitanga). Others spoke of her gentleness, care and heart for all. What an opportunity for our tamariki to acknowledge the past as they step into the future.

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

#### BANANA MUFFINS shared by Melissa

Looking for a new banana muffin recipe for lunchboxes? Check this one out!

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

11/2 cups plain flour

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp baking soda

pinch of salt

1 tsp cinnamon (optional)

1 cup rolled oats

1/4 c brown sugar

1/2 c coconut 2 ripe banana's

**1/4 c** neutral oil

11/4 c milk of your choice

**1 tsp** vanilla essence

Optional - add 1/2 cup chopped dark chocolate

#### METHOD:

**Preheat** oven to 175deg. Prepare a 12 cup muffin tray, - grease if needed. **Sift** flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt & cinnamon into a large bowl. **Add** rolled oats, brown sugar and coconut.


 $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{Mash}}$  the banana and in a separate bowl combine with oil, milk and vanilla essence.

**Add** the wet mix to the dry ingredients and stir gently until just combined. **Spoon** the mixture into the prepared muffin tins.

Optional - place a few slices of banana or a little chocolate on top.

**Bake for 20 minutes**, or until a toothpick comes out clean when you stick it into a muffin.


## **Exhibition Wall**

# Sports News



#### **SPORTS TERM 4**

#### Touch

This is for students in Years 1-6. The teams get split into year 1-2, 3-4 and 5-6. Games are played at Wakefield Park on Wednesdays between 3:30pm and 5:30pm. The season dates are 30 October - 4 December (6 weeks). The teams consist of 5 on the field with a maximum of 10 players per team. We need 8 players per team. The fees for touch will be \$25 per player. Uniforms may be provided where supply allows. We will need a coach and manager for each team and this job can be shared between two people if necessary.

Mini polo

Mini polo is played in the 1.2 m pool at the Wellington Regional Aquatic Centre (Kilbirnie pools). Mini polo has 6 players in the pool plus the goalie. Ideally there will be 8 players per team. Your child must be able to swim and being able to touch the bottom of the pool would be very beneficial. Children will wear their own togs and Newtown School polo caps will be provided at the games. Open to Years 4, 5 and 6. Each team will benefit from one or two whānau managers; these volunteers manage substitutions and communicate with whānau. Games are on Friday afternoons, from 18 October to 13 December.

#### **Futsal**

This is for students in Year 1-6. The teams will be split into a Year 1/2 team, a Year 3/4 team, and a year 5 / 6 team. Games are played at Akau Tangi Stadium on Friday afternoons. The first game is Friday 25 October. Games run from 3.30 pm - 6 pm.

We will need a coach and manager for each team. One person can take on both roles, or the jobs can be shared between several people.

#### Junior Netball

This is for students in Year 1-4. The teams will be split into a Year 1/2 team and Year 3/4 team. This is played on Saturdays at Evans Bay Intermediate School on their netball courts. First game is Saturday 19 October. The times of the games will be confirmed closer to the start of the season.

It is part of the Future Ferns programme. We will need a coach and manager for each team. One person can take on both roles, or the jobs can be shared between two people.

If you wish to, you can attend a training session run by Motu Kairangi Netball for the coaching role. You will have ongoing support at the games. We will also need a manager to oversee the team. The fee for this is \$40 for the season. 
